Assistant Veterinarian

Reporting to the Fish Health Manager, the Assistant Veterinarian will provide support in the management of fish health, welfare and biosecurity across the company's aquaculture's hatchery and marine farm sites.

Responsibilities

As Assistant Veterinarian you will support the implementation and continuous improvement of the Veterinary Health Plan. With a hands-on approach, the Assistant Veterinarian will also be responsible for disease diagnosis and general fish health, welfare and biosecurity, including field investigations and post mortem analysis and reporting.

As the Assistant Veterinarian you will also be required to travel to our other farm and hatchery sites across the state.

Qualifications & Experience

It is an inherent requirement of this position that work be performed safely whilst upholding the company's values. You will be a highly motivated person eager to learn and uphold the company's commitment to innovation and best practice. The appointed person must be able to build and maintain strong working relationships with key stakeholders. Knowledge of work health and safety regulations is preferred.

Successful applicants will hold a tertiary qualification in Veterinary Science and a current driver's licence. Knowledge of the aquaculture industry, and an understanding of the current issues facing fish farming in the region would be highly regarded.

A valid Coxswains or diving certificates and/or experience in a similar area is desirable but not essential.

Recent university graduates, with enthusiasm for a career in salmonid production are encouraged to apply.

In this instance, an online application form allows you to attach a resume and a cover letter. There is no requirement to respond separately to the selection criteria, therefore you should address the few selection criteria as part of your one to two page cover letter.
